Occupational training also helps alleviate the anxiety and uncertainty about the future, improving the psychological well-being of inmates and decreasing the likelihood of security incidents within the prison. This has a positive impact on maintaining prison order.

They not only influence the personal growth and transformation of inmates but also have a positive effect on internal prison management and societal reintegration. This provides inmates with an opportunity to move towards a more positive future upon their release.







FORKLIFT OPERATION TRAINING CLASS

The forklift operation training class aims to provide practical vocational skills for inmates to assist in their reintegration into society.
